What is Midlands Rail Hub?

Up to £2bn infrastructure investment in central Birmingham and on a number of rail corridors that connect other Midlands towns & cities with Birmingham

Will allow more trains and faster trains to/from cities including Hereford, Worcester, Bristol, Cardiff and Leicester, improving regional connectivity

Joint project developed and promoted by Midlands Connect, Network Rail and West Midlands Combined Authority / Rail Executive



The Bordesley Chords & Central Birmingham


Bordesley Chords – the largest single component of Midlands Rail Hub:

- West Chord: allows services from South-West (for example, Hereford) to run into Birmingham Moor Street
- East Chord: allows services from the East Midlands (for example, Leicester) to run into Birmingham Moor Street

Additional platform capacity is also planned at Snow Hill and Moor Street Stations




The Integrated Rail Plan – November 2021




East / East Midlands Parkway

Midlands Rail Hub - October 2022




MRH Packages
